All our PP children receive full funding for breakfast and after school clubs, we support financially with part paying for the school uniform as well as school trips. Please fill in the form just in case, as you might be eligible and therefore missing out on that form of support now.

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School Clubs provision for 2024-2025

We will be running the following clubs this academic year. Breakfast and Homework clubs run as usual eerie days already, however other clubs will resume within the next two weeks.

Safeguarding reminder- if a parent/ carer fails to collect a child at the end of the day from after school clubs, **we call social services as well as the police within 10 minutes** of agreed collection time. Our support staff do not stay longer than 4:30pm, so you must collect your children from clubs at the agreed times.

- Breakfast Club 7:45am- 8:35am; After School Homework Club from 3:15 till 4:30pm. These are bookable on a week by week basis through Wise Pay at the cost of £3.
- Football, multi-sport and gymnastics provided by Premier Sport's professionals, and bookable via their own webpage, please click here to go to their website for booking.
- Art and gardening clubs from 3:15 to 4:15pm, at the cost of £3 per child. Clubs will be based on the first come first served basis and will be funded by the parents. The clubs will run on a half termly basis to ensure the rota of children who are interested, so that we can ensure fair access to the after school club services. If you are in receipt of PP funding (check your eligibility as the school may be able to part fund the clubs provision for you)
